

# 5 Day Devotional

## Day 1: From Information to Intimacy

### Devotional

Think about the people closest to you. You didn't start as best friends or spouses - relationships develop through stages. The same is true with God. Many people know facts about God like they know facts about George Washington, but God wants so much more. He desires intimate communion with you, not just casual acquaintance. This journey from knowing about God to truly knowing Him personally begins with recognizing that information alone isn't enough. Your heart needs transformation, not just your head. God isn't satisfied with being a distant historical figure in your life - He wants to be your closest companion, the One you turn to in every moment. The beautiful truth is that this intimate relationship is available to everyone who seeks it through Jesus Christ.

### Bible Verse

'Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.'" - John 14:6

### Reflection Question

What level of relationship do you currently have with God - information, association, companion, or communion?

### Quote

Knowing God intimately means knowing His Son, Jesus personally. There's no other way.

### Prayer

Lord, I don't want to just know about You - I want to know You personally and intimately. Draw me closer to Your heart and transform my relationship with You from mere information to deep communion.

## Day 2: The Heart Connection

### Devotional

There's a vast difference between head knowledge and heart knowledge. You can memorize every Bible verse, attend every church service, and still miss the most important part - letting God's truth sink deep into your heart where it transforms how you live. Real intimacy with God happens when His Word moves from your mind to your heart, changing not just what you think but who you are. This heart-level knowledge often comes through life's trials and sufferings, where you discover God's faithfulness in ways you never could through books alone. In those difficult moments, you hear the Holy Spirit whisper, 'You are mine. I've got you.' That's when information becomes transformation, and facts become faith that sustains you through anything.

### Bible Verse

'That I may know him and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of sharing in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death' - Philippians 3:10

### Reflection Question

Can you think of a time when God's truth moved from your head to your heart through a difficult experience?

### Quote

There is something between here and here that isn't just 18 inches. It's a long ways we can know about God. We can know information, we can read and study His Word. But does it sink into our heart?

### Prayer

Father, help Your Word sink deep into my heart, not just my mind. Use both joyful and difficult circumstances to deepen my intimate knowledge of who You are.

## Day 3: Anchored in Truth

### Devotional

In our world of 'your truth' and 'my truth,' we desperately need the anchor of God's unchanging Word. The Bereans provide a beautiful example - they eagerly received Paul's message but carefully examined Scripture to verify its truth. This balance of openness and discernment is crucial for growing in intimate knowledge of God. When you become a serious student of God's Word, reading it consistently and applying it daily, something amazing happens. The Holy Spirit takes what you're reading and applies it directly to your current situation. It's not just ancient text anymore - it becomes God's personal message to you today. This is how we stay grounded in truth while growing deeper in relationship with the One who is Truth itself.

### Bible Verse

'Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth.' - 2 Timothy 2:15

### Reflection Question

How consistently are you studying God's Word, and how is it currently speaking to your daily life?

### Quote

Knowing God means that I'm becoming a student of God's Word, that I am reading it, I'm applying it, that I'm discerning what I hear in life and I'm determined to stay the course, to be in the Word.

### Prayer

Lord, make me a diligent student of Your Word. Help me not just read it, but apply it and allow Your Spirit to speak through it into my daily circumstances.

## Day 4: Following His Lead

### Devotional

True intimacy with God means surrendering control of your life to Him. It's moving from being the driver to being completely dependent on His guidance. When you know God intimately, you become sensitive to His Spirit's leading - staying when He says stay, moving when He says move. This isn't about losing your identity; it's about finding your true purpose under His loving leadership. God sets up divine appointments in the most ordinary places - your neighborhood, the grocery store, your workplace. But you have to be willing to follow His lead and be available for these supernatural moments in natural settings. The deeper your relationship with God grows, the more you trust His direction, even when you can't see the full picture.

### Bible Verse

'You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.' - Jeremiah 29:13

### Reflection Question

In what areas of your life are you still trying to maintain control instead of following God's lead?

### Quote

Knowing God means that I'm allowing him to lead my life. I want him to direct my life. I want him to take me step by step through life. I'm not in charge. I'm not even the co pilot.

### Prayer

God, I surrender control of my life to You. Make me sensitive to Your Spirit's leading and willing to follow wherever You guide me, even in ordinary moments.

# Day 5: Sharing the Light

## Devotional

When you truly know God intimately, you can't help but make Him known to others. Paul's heart was stirred by the lostness he saw in Athens, but notice his response - he didn't condemn or criticize. Instead, he found common ground and built bridges to share the gospel. This is the natural overflow of intimate relationship with God - a heart that breaks for those who don't know Him yet. You don't need to be a preacher or missionary to share God's love. Sometimes the most supernatural moments happen in the most natural places when you're simply willing to turn on the light of Christ in someone's darkness. The goal isn't to win arguments but to win hearts by showing them the God who made them for relationship with Himself.

## Bible Verse

'For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.' - 1 Corinthians 1:18

## Reflection Question

Who in your life needs to hear about God's love, and how can you build a bridge to share that with them?

## Quote

Listen, information is good, but transformation is so much better. And transformation comes with the gospel of Jesus Christ.

## Prayer

Lord, give me a heart that breaks for those who don't know You yet. Help me build bridges, not walls, and be willing to share Your light in the darkness around me.
